1. Meeting Opening

The meeting was called to order by the Chair at 9:00 a.m. and a round table introduction was held.

1.2. Previous Minutes

1.2.1. Adoption of November 23, 2017 Minutes

2. Matters for Decision [Motion Needed]

2.1. Letter Ballot 09-17

The result of the letter ballot was included in the portal and reviewed.

2.2. Appointment of Dale Walls

2.3. Reappointment of Simon Jolly

The nomination was included in the portal and reviewed.

Verne Quiring / Mike Turek moved to recommend to the Board, the reappointment of Simon Jolly to the Gas Sub-Council, representing the Mechanical Contractors industry segment for a term until January 31, 2021, effective immediately; CARRIED

2.4. Reappointment of Denis Turgeon

The nomination was included in the portal.

Jeff Skeith / Verne Quiring moved to recommend to the Board, the reappointment of Denis Turgeon to the Gas Sub-Council, representing the Education and Training industry segment for a term until January 31, 2021, effective immediately; CARRIED

2.5. Appointment of Vice Chair

With Verne Quiring's retirement, this creates a vacancy of the Vice Chair position.

The floor was opened for nominations and Denis Turgeon was nominated. After 3 calls and no further nominations, *Denis Turgeon was appointed as the Vice Chair of the Gas Sub-Council, by acclamation*.

The Chair reported that his term expires in January 2019 and there is a need for Sub-Council members to consider this for future discussion.

4. Matters for Discussion

4.1. Secondary Gas Lines

An excerpt from the minutes of February 2, 2017 and further information from the Alberta Mechanical Officials Society (AMOS) were included in the portal and reviewed.

The Vice Chair emphasized that it is believed the most critical aspects to consider regarding this agenda item is the need to ensure public safety.

The Chair noted that because the exemption would have to be included in the Permit Regulation, the decision will likely need to be made at a higher level.

Jeff Skeith reported that it is the opinion of the Federation of Alberta Gas Co-ops and their individual gas co-ops that permitting of secondary gas lines does not create an increase in safety. The gas co-op would ensure that the secondary gas line is locked off until permits are taken out for any additional work. The only exemption would be relative to its own gas co-op members. Any secondary lines installed on behalf of another utility would continue to require a permit.

From the inspector perspective, AMOS members believe that all secondary lines need to be permitted and inspected, regardless of who does the work. Concern was expressed that the gas could be turned on without the Authority Having Jurisdiction being aware on the secondary line installation. It was clarified that in Federal of Alberta Gas Co-op's proposal, a form was created to ensure that all relative parties are notified of any secondary line installation.

Background documentation will be included in the portal for the benefit of new members and for further review by the sub-council. [Council Administration/All]

4.2. TCC Report

The Chair reported on topics that were discussed at the last TCC meeting:

- Alberta Association of Accredited Organization requested a seat on several sub-councils, not just the Gas Sub-Council
- A brief overview was provided regarding the Council's Governance Review which has put the matrix change recommendations on hold

4.2.1. Continuing Education for SCOs Working Group Membership

It was reported that a request will be forthcoming from the Council for a representative from each sub-council to serve on the Working Group.

4.3. NOVA Chemicals Update

During action items, the Chair reported that he has tried to contact Nova Chemicals to get the presentation.

4.4. Gas Certification Body & Inspection Body General Meeting Report

A meeting is scheduled with all Gas Certification Bodies and Inspection Bodies on January 24, 2018. The Chair is unavailable, and a volunteer was sought for participation from this sub-council. Denis Turgeon agreed to represent the sub-council. It was also noted that anyone else could participate via conference call and if so, to advise the Administrator. [All]

Clarification was provided regarding Inspection Bodies no longer being able to approve uncertified equipment if a standard is not available for that product. CBs and IBs are currently issuing a great deal of variances and this process has been greatly streamlined. It was noted, however, that these variances are deviations from the code under the CB or IB authority and are not the same as the variances (or alternative solutions) that are registered with the Council. There may be a need to determine how to collect data on these deviations.

AMA will be establishing clarification to assist SCOs in understanding their role relative to these field approvals.

4.5. Working Group Reports

Each working group reported the following:

CSA-B149.1-20 – Natural gas and propane installation code

Verne Quiring has agreed to remain on the working group but a new Chair from the sub-council will be required.

The 3-column document is included in the portal and continues to be reviewed.

CSA-B149.2-20 – Propane storage and handling code

The 3-column document is included in the portal. The changes are relatively minor and will be reviewed after the meeting.

CSA-B149.3-20 – Code for the field approval of fuel-related components on appliances and equipment

Verne Quiring has agreed to remain on the working group and Glen Aspen agreed to serve as the working group Chair. The 3-column document is included in the portal and will be reviewed after the meeting.

CSA-B149.5-20 – Installation code for propane fuel systems and tanks on highway vehicles

The 3-column document is included in the portal and will be reviewed after the meeting.

CSA-B108-17 – Natural gas fuelling stations installation code

It was reported that the 3-column document is under development and expected to be completed in the next 2 weeks.

CSA-B109-17 – Natural gas for vehicles installation code

The working group continues to review the changes.

4.6. B149.3-20 Annex J

The Gas Administrator provided a high-level overview of the proposed changes for Annex J. It was noted this is a complex Annex. This will be reviewed by the working group. It was noted that there are concerns amongst CSA committee members that Annex J is too broad and is insufficient to address public safety. In Alberta, this will be addressed through third-party IBs and CBs to ensure safety is addressed. The item was added as a separate agenda item to simply heighten awareness of the issue. In future, this will be addressed during the working group discussions.

The proposed changes will be added to the working group folder on the portal.

4.7. Administrator's Report

It was clarified that this agenda item was created as other sub-councils include this to provide updates on what other things may be happening in the department or in the discipline.

The Administrator reported on the following:

- Tank filling enforcement issues in the oil field industry and local authorities are not seeing them because they aren't being permitted; even if not permitted, industry still needs to comply with the codes and some propane companies are refusing to fill the tanks; crossjurisdictional between Gas, ABSA and Alberta Transportation and an overview was provided of the different aspect each jurisdiction looks at; clarification was provided regarding them being approved for transport and therefore can be moved when 100% full; working on trying to get these tanks certified and labeled
- A brief update was provided on other issues that have come forward this past month including home-made equipment, cauldrons, and press swing joints

4.8. Council Updates

The following was reported:

- Members were reminded that nominations for the Dr. Sauer Award are being accepted now until March 30, 2018. Nomination forms are available on the main page of the portal. The award recognizes an exceptional sub-council member and members were encouraged to submit a nomination.
- The two other award nomination applications are also available on the portal.
- The Council would like to move the annual matrix review to be finalized by May each year.
- Effective Meetings Training and Appeals Training workshops are scheduled for April 11-12 and Oct 17-18.

Members were reminded that the Council is moving offices in April 2018 and meeting space will be available for all sub-council meetings to be held there. Information is being gathered to assist Council Members like accommodations, parking, etc. Members were asked about any suggestions that would ease the transition, which is planned for the fall 2018.

4.9 Radon

An overview was provided regarding some of the issues that are being encountered because of unfinished concrete beneath the furnaces. It is believed there is a need to address the issue. Although some ensure a finished floor, this is not happening in all cases and this creates a safety issue.

The Chair will bring the matter up at the TCC and with the Building Sub-Council Chair. [Aspen]

4.10 Furnaces for Construction

It was reported that some furnace contractors in the Wood Buffalo area are being put in a bad position as they have been instructed to install furnaces during construction for temporary heat, but the furnaces are not certified for such a use.

It was questioned what it would take to get a heater certified for temporary heat. It was reported that there are a few manufacturers that are pursuing this certification for heaters that could then be moved from site to site.

It was reported that both BC and Ontario have issued bulletins similar to the Gas Information Bulletin that was issued in Alberta in 2017. BC has specifically said if you use a furnace during construction that is not certified for that use, it must be thrown away.

A brief discussion was held about what practices are being used throughout various areas in the province. It is believed that SCOs are doing their best to ensure compliance but it won't always be easy to enforce.

5. Meeting Finalization

5.1. Meeting and Agenda Feedback

A round table discussion was held. Verne Quiring thanked everyone for the opportunity to work with all the sub-council members over the past 9 years. Verne Quiring was thanked for his contribution to the gas sub-council and the safety system.

5.2. Next Meeting

The next meeting was reconfirmed for Thursday, May 17, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. in Edmonton.

5.2.1. 2018 Conference & AGM: May 30 – June 1, 2018, Rimrock Hotel, Banff AB

Members were reminded that the AGM and Conference will be May 30 to June 1, 2018 at the Rimrock Hotel in Banff. Registration will begin in about mid-February.

New members were advised that all expenses for sub-council members are covered by the Council. The speakers are great, and it is an excellent opportunity to interact with other sub-councils. The Chair encouraged all members to participate.
