4.1. 2019 Meeting Dates

4.1.1. Meeting Start Time

Consensus was reached to retain the 9:00 a.m. start time.

4.2. IGAC/CSA Technical Meeting Participant Feedback

Feedback was provided regarding participating in the IGAC / CSA Technical Meetings. Generally, it was an educational experience. There was excellent participation from Albertans and positive feedback was received from CSA.

4.3. Draft Annex J

Draft Annex J was included in the portal and reviewed. It was noted that Annex J is not included in the three-column document. The annex is informative and is a performance-based alternative to the prescriptive requirements. IGAC did not accept the annex for inclusion in the code, even though the committee believes they've addressed all of IGAC's concerns.

This led to a discussion regarding the current exemptions and whether some may need to be back under the jurisdiction of ABSA.

The Administrator will continue to keep the sub-council informed of the progress on Annex J.

4.4. Draft Updated Standards STANDATA

The draft STANDATA was included in the portal. It was clarified that this would include any referenced standards that are included in the codes. There were no concerns from the Gas discipline regarding the joint STANDATA. Clarification was provided regarding the timing between the National level and Alberta Codes and this STANDATA provides that flexibility.

This item was considered closed and will be removed from the agenda. [Council Administration]

4.5. Administrator/AMA Report

The Administrator reported on the following:

- IGAC meeting discussions, a public report will be included in the portal when available
- ORDs Other Recognized Documents were reviewed
- Vaporizer ORD was retired but since has been brought back with support from enforcement by regulators.
- By January 1, 2021, all Vaporizers will have to be certified
- Code change proposals are anticipated for under 20,000 BTUs and manual appliances
- OEM vehicles can voluntarily participate
- The Standards Council of Canada will be working with European manufacturers for products than can be used in Canada; SCOs will have some challenges in learning how to read labels to ensure they are certified for use in Canada
- Hydrogen Fueling Stations a permitting guide is being developed and will be passed along to the working group
- Discussions were held regarding revisions needed for B149.3 relative to Annex J
- Issues identified with coated copper piping, this was also discussed at propane industry meetings
- The new CSA B108 has been published and available to the Working Group for review, this will become in force in or around September 1, 2019 unless recommendations are brought forward to the contrary
- Work has started picking up on Legacy Equipment

An in-depth discussion was held regarding the CETA Agreement, how to manage the process and whether there will be a process in place to report products that are not certified or equivalent. Canadian markings were explained, and it was noted that the public also needs to be knowledgeable about the products they are purchasing.

A discussion was held regarding certified equipment, approval of uncertified equipment, and that the Administrator-Only requirement is proposed to be changed so that all SCOs have that ability.

It was questioned regarding a recent gas explosion outside of Canada and a brief update was provided on information that has been made available.

4.6. AMOS Report

There was nothing new to report. Concerns are being expressed regarding SCOs issuing variances and the potential of inconsistencies. It was suggested that it is not likely going to be issues within a single jurisdiction. However, inconsistencies across jurisdictions could be a challenge.

The notice that will be issued hopefully will provide the necessary guidance. It was noted that there are very few Administrator-only variances currently being issued. AMA has committed to providing the necessary resources to manage this transition.

4.7. Council Updates

- An overview was provided on new formatting of the action item list

4.8. Furnaces for Construction Heating

The Administrator reported on challenges that have occurred with the use of furnaces during construction. Although this was agreed by all major manufacturers, one manufacturer has decided not to adhere to this agreement. Their manufacturer's instructions state that the furnace can be used for both construction and after construction, and they have stated they are not interested in changing their manufacturer's instruction. It is likely the STANDATA will need to be reviewed to determine if any revisions are needed.

The Administrator provided an overview of discussions with Intertek regarding certification and interpretation of the furnace standard and separately with CSA regarding the standard, rationale and interpretation. It was confirmed that it was never the intent of the standard to be occupancy or construction, but could be both. The agreement among manufacturers has been considered a separate topic altogether.

This led to an in-depth discussion regarding how this would affect homeowners, the furnace warranty and potential new home warranty issues. This is compounded by homeowners potentially being unaware that a warranty would be void until there is an issue.

From an industry perspective, there is disappointment in how this has shifted back because

homeowner protection is key. This led to a discussion regarding contractor responsibilities and the pressure they are being put under by some home builders.

It was suggested that a public awareness campaign is needed and reported that AHRI is looking into this.

An in-depth discussion was held regarding an appropriate path forward. It was suggested that this should be brought back to the attention of the New Home Warranty Program, a proposed change be considered and for the Chair to bring this to the attention of the TCC.

Jason Helfrich / Chuck Lemke moved that Alberta submit a docket to CSA B149.1 for a proposed change that a furnace used during construction cannot be used for heating a building after construction; CARRIED [Helfrich / Lemke / Manning]

Additional information and photographs were included in the portal as an alternative to temporary heat.

4.9 Approvals and Permit Bulletin
