<u>ASME</u>

ASME Committee meetings were held via Zoom throughout the month of August. Notable items

ASME is considering introducing a definition of "unfired steam boilers" in Section VIII. Many years ago, Section I published interpretation (I-81-01) and provided definition of "unfired steam boilers". This definition is not well known and needs further clarifications. Section VIII Committee is currently working on proposal to add the definition of "unfired steam boiler" in U-1(g) and establish rules when a pressure vessel may be designed and fabricated as an "unfired steam boiler" in accordance with Section VIII, Div.1. An alternate approach under consideration is that the term and rules for "unfired steam boilers" should be removed from the Section VIII, Div. 1.

The Section VIII Task Group on Scope and Exemptions has been working with the U.S. refrigeration industry in exploring different options on revising the scope of Section VIII, Div. 1.

The decision was made in the August 2020 meeting to continue work and propose changes in 2023 edition.

BPV VIII SC decided to annul Code Case 2695-1 six months after an announcement in the next Code Case Supplement. Code Case 2695-1 that allows the use of Section VIII, Division 2 rules in construction of Section VIII, Division 1 vessels is no longer necessary because Appendix 46 has been introduced into the 2019 Edition of Division 1.

The information was provided about reorganizing ASME code courses. ASME would like to establish two training streams

- Manufacturer path (more courses on design and inspection, shop knowledge, etc.)
- Owner-user path (more courses on inspection, etc.)

As the first step, ASME is planning to reorganize and merge basic course for Div. 1 and Div. 2 (reasons: 60% overlaps and potential for more use of Div. 2 through Div. 1, Appendix 46). This may help with the new (2021 Edition) requirements in Div. 1 for demonstrating competences of designers.

The new book Section XIII *Rules for Overpressure Protection* is scheduled to be published with the 2021 edition of the ASME BPVC.

The code of construction for the boiler or pressure vessel will retain some overpressure protection requirements and will point users to Section XIII for other details.
