4. Matters for Discussion

4.1. Combination Water Closet and Lav

An IAPMO Certificate of Listing document was included in the portal, showing the Profile Smart 305 appliance which is now certified for use in Canada. Further research is being done to gather more information and whether there are any risks if these appliances are allowed in Alberta. From an economical perspective, it is believed there could be a push for these types of devices.

4.2. Reference Standards

4.2.1. NSF

There was nothing new to report on NSF 40. An overview was provided of ongoing minor changes to other NSF Standards.

4.2.2. ULC

There was nothing new to report on committee work.

It was reported that a UL Advisory Council meeting is being held in April 2019.

4.2.3. CSA

It was reported the CSA Z800-18 – Guideline on basement flood protection and risk reduction Standard has been published.

CSA is working on the process to provide their standards at no charge for online read-only access. NFPA is also looking at something similar.

4.2.4. ASSE

There was nothing new to report.

4.3. NPC 2020 Working Group Report

Quenton Kusiek reported that the Working Group met after the last PSC meeting and reviewed the proposed changes. The 3-column document is available on the portal. The Working Group provided feedback on several proposed changes through the public review consultation that was available online until January 4, 2019.

The Administrator provided an overview of the process at the national level. Some changes will move forward for the NPC 2020 but many of them, including some from Alberta, will be deferred until 2025. No new information was brought forward for the Working Group from today's

meeting. A brief discussion was held regarding potential additional working group and/or sub-council meetings that may be required closer to the end of 2019, relative to both the 2020 NPC and the PSDS Standard of Practice.

4.4. PSDS Working Group Report

The PSDS Working Group Chair's report was included in the portal. The PSDS Administrator summarized the following discussion from the last meeting:

- ASCA is seeking feedback on their proposed permit application (included in the portal)
- Matrix review:
 - Work Camp industry representative now on the working group
 - Consideration is being given to recommending representation from Health and Environment, an installer and a Hydrogeologist
- Members have volunteered to assist the Administrator regarding new technologies consideration
- Consideration is being given to creating additional certification specific to Designers and a high-level draft list of competencies has been developed

It was clarified that ASCA has only one form, per discipline, for unaccredited municipalities.

4.5. AMOS Report

There was nothing new to report as a meeting has not been held yet this year.

4.6. AMA/Administrator Report

Although there are a lot of administrative things happening, there was nothing new to report relative to policy.

The Plumbing Administrator reported on the following:

- NPC 2020 being developed by NRC's Plumbing and HVAC standing committee
- NPC Public consultation is now closed, industry concerns about
 - Water reuse
 - Rainwater harvesting
- Water reuse public consultation
 - Guidelines
 - Website update
 - STANDATA update
- NPC revisions/errata and challenge regarding questions of potential substantial changes
- Scope of plumbing systems
 - All activities with plumbing and drainage on a single property including irrigation unless regulated by other ministries
- Public vs private washrooms

- Accepting a relaxation of the code vs. variances and alternate solutions and the requirement to prove an equal or greater level of safety is a challenge; there may be opportunity to heighten awareness amongst SCOs in all disciplines; this is a great challenge that the RMA Working Group is concerned with regarding taking over the acceptance of setback distance variances for PSDS
- Furnaces for construction is a big challenge, industry is moving toward allowing furnaces to be used for construction as per manufacturer's installation instructions.

The PSDS Administrator reported on the following:

- The Working Group review of the Standard of Practice will include how to incorporate the handbook directly in the SOP
- An update was provided with the RMA Working Group and the agreement to create a pilot project with interested municipalities
- The next RMA Working Group meeting is in February 2019
- Group B SCO course material revisions have been received and needs to be reviewed by Subject Matter Experts
- The AOWMA conference will be from February 7 to 9 in Red Deer

An updated 3-column document on proposed changes needed to the SOP will be added to portal in the PSDS Working Group folder. [Morin]
