#### **Selection Committee & Process**

The Safety Codes Council Indigenous Bursary committee is comprised of the following:

- The Administrator of Certification, or delegate
- The Team Lead (Certification), or delegate
- Three additional members representing safety system and Indigenous stakeholders from a variety of sectors and disciplines, appointed by the Administrator of Certification.

#### **Selection Criteria**

After meeting the eligibility criteria, award recipients will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Financial need
- A high potential to contribute positively to the Safety Codes system based on previous experience and identified interests
- Demonstrated need within the community for safety codes officer training
- Identification of community readiness to support the student with certification.

These criteria will be assessed based on the applicant's submission.

#### **Bursary Amount**

The amount of the bursary varies, but will not exceed 75% of the certification cost for the discipline and level indicated on the bursary application form.

#### **FOIP Statement**

The personal information requested on this form is being collected for the purpose of selecting bursary recipients, notifying recipients, and disbursement of the Indigenous bursary.
