

## Electrical Safety Codes Officer II Job Number: 41687

As an Electrical Safety Codes Officer II, you will lead and mentor a team of Safety Codes Officers working towards ensuring a safe built environment for citizens.

With a focus on the City of Edmonton's Cultural Commitments to Safe, Helpful, Accountable, Integrated, and Excellent, you will:

- Conduct plans examination and review of permit applications for new electrical systems, changes or alterations to buildings and structures by assessment for compliance with bylaws, codes, regulations, and other municipal standards
- Inspection of buildings during construction, renovation, or alterations to ensure conformance with approved plans, requirements, Alberta Safety Codes Act, and Canadian Electrical Code
- Coach applicants to resolve issues related to a particular permit application and follow up on conditions and notices to ensure
  deficiencies are corrected
- Provide interpretations and information relating to the Canadian Electrical Code, bylaws, or other regulations to the contractors, designers, developers, or citizens
- Build relationships with builders, applicants, contractors, and other external stakeholders to enhance City reputation and service delivery
- Create and issue permits—including authority to withhold, suspend, revoke, and extend permits through existing processes; keep accurate records in POSSE
- Consult with or assist other municipal working units, adjacent disciplines and Service Centre Staff, provincial authorities, or associations on complex information

- Create reports or other correspondence detailing any questions or deficiencies found on site as well as actions taken and recommendations provided
- · Attend and participate in safety meetings and environmental protection training
- · Perform other related duties as required

## Qualifications:

- Completion of Grade 12
- Electrical Engineering technologist diploma in a related field and 8 years of relevant experience in the building construction industry
  after obtaining the diploma OR Journeyman Electrician Certificate with 6 years experience after obtaining the Journeyman certificate
  OR an Electrical Engineering degree and 8 years of relevant experience in the building construction industry, at least one of which must
  be completed after obtaining that degree
- Registered as a Safety Codes Officer having satisfactorily completed training achieving certification as Electrical Group A with Safety Codes Council in the Province of Alberta
- Excellent knowledge of the Safety Codes Act, the Canadian Electrical Code, City Bylaws and related policies, procedures and regulations as they pertain to residential buildings. Must possess the ability to analyze and interpret legislation
- Demonstrated knowledge of standard methods, techniques, materials, tools, and equipment employed in the building construction trades with experience involving residential, part 9, and part 3 projects
- Ability to analyze and interpret simple plans or designs prepared by applicants, architects, and/or engineers
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills to interact with architects, engineers, developers, and educate citizens about Safety Codes interpretations, applications, and enforcement
- Demonstrated interpersonal skills to provide customer needs with professionalism and to work effectively on a team
- Strong decision making, organizational, and prioritization skills to manage multiple priorities and projects
- Proficient in the use of computers and software programs for data entry, plan review, and communication with customers
- Demonstrated ability to achieve results in the context of a respectful, inclusive, and service-minded style
